Milan, 28th October Italy 2021

IEC, ISO and ITU¹ drive international standards and conformity assessment work that is instrumental for the three main pillars of the 2021 G20, People, Planet and Prosperity, to support global efforts to build a more peaceful, sustainable, and fairer future.

The global economy is facing unprecedented challenges. These have been intensified by the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the climate emergency. The international standards community must drive forward its multilateral efforts as we navigate through unstable times and look ahead to a robust, balanced, and inclusive global economic recovery.
